

Tenjinbashi Shopping Street & Ichijo Shrine Walking Course

about 10 minutes walk

Ichijo Shrine is the closest shrine to New Royal Hotel Shimanto. This is a course that allows you to visit Ichijo Shrine while enjoying the shops in the shopping district.

This shrine was built in 1862 by volunteers who remembered the virtues of the Tosa Ichijo clan on the site of the Ichijo family mausoleum, which was located at the top of Komoriyama, part of the former Nakamura Imperial Palace. The Tosa Ichijo clan began with Ichijo Norifusa, the former regent who came down to the area during the Onin War over 550 years ago, and for four generations thereafter, they devoted themselves to the development of culture and economy in Nakamura. The shrine enshrines the spirits of the successive generations of the Tosa Ichijo clan, including Norifusa's

father, Kaneyoshi.

The shrine is affectionately known to local residents as "Ichijoko-san," and the Ichijo Festival, held every November, features a variety of events over three days, including a lantern procession lit by sacred fire donated by Shimogamo Shrine in Kyoto. The current shrine building was built in 1944.
